Starship Farragut in Pre-Production of Second Film *First Film, "The Captaincy" is in Post Production*

WASHINGTON, DC, August 30, 2006 — Starship Farragut, an independent film project based on the original series of Star Trek, today announced that it will begin filming its second film, "For Want of a Nail" on October 14, 2006 at the Black Box Theatre at the Indian Head Center for the Arts in Indian Head, Md.

"After wrapping up filming for our pilot in July, we immediately coordinated efforts with our cast and crew to begin our second film," said John Broughton, Executive Producer. "This project continues to be a great creative outlet for everyone involved, and we're committed to delivering innovative story lines for our audience to enjoy. In fact, the second adventure for the crew of the Farragut takes place back on Earth, but in America's past."

Starship Farragut's pilot episode, "The Captaincy" is currently in post-production with NEO f/x (www.neo-fx.com) which provides state-of-the art, digital effects for the project. The pilot film will debut at the Farpoint convention in Hunt Valley, Maryland in February 2007.
